


**REV. WALTER
P. BIKACSAN**
1920-2010


The First Hungarian Baptist Church of Akron, OH, was Rev. Bikacsan's home church, where he accepted Christ as his Savior and was baptized by Rev. Ladislaus Lovas. His parents, Flore and Bertha File Bikacsan, were long-time members of the church and helped him grow in the grace and knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ. He was active particularly in the choir and the band until he entered service in the Navy in World War II.

By 1946 he answered God's call to the ministry. After his marriage to Gizella (Szabo) Taylor of Wadsworth, OR, they went to Sioux Falls College, SD, where for a year on week-ends after classes they, along with Gizella's brother Elmer Taylor and his wife Ruth, served as a Gospel Team for the college. The Bikacsans returned to Ohio and in 1950 he graduated from Cleveland Bible College (now Malone University of Canton), receiving the Bachelor of Theology degree.

Rev. Bikacsan was ordained in June, 1950 by the Huntsburg Baptist Church and the Ohio Baptist Convention. He served in both Hungarian and English languages there until 1952. A second bi-lingual pastorate was served at High Street Baptist Church in New Brunswick, NJ from 1954 to 1961. In 1956 after the Hungarian Revolution, Rev. Bikacsan helped with the processing of those at Camp Kilmer under the auspices of the Baptist World Alliance and the capable leadership of Dr. Bela Udvarnoki. He also served as treasurer of the Building Committee for Bethesda Baptist Home in Palm Bay, FL. He served five other American Baptist congregations, all English, until he retired to Etowah, TN in 1984. Even in retirement he filled in for pastors and was active in church life until illness set him aside. He went Home to the Lord on Sunday, September 19, 2010, at 90 years of age.

Funeral services were held in Etowah Baptist Church and in Akron, Ohio. Burial was in Northlawn Memorial Gardens, Peninsula, Ohio, with a 21 gun sa-

lute and the "Doxology" with joined hands.

He is survived by his wife of 64 years, Gizella; sons Ronald and Dennis and daughter Sharon and husband William Halter; also his sister and husband, Violet and Ernest Lehoczky.

In Memoriam: Zoltán Vékás

Zoltán Vékás, past vice president of the Hungarian Baptist Convention of Romania and who represented the Baptist group at several Baptist World Alliance and European Baptist Federation events, died from colon cancer, on November 24, in Satu Mare, Romania. He was 61 years old.

Vékás was, for 12 years, editor in chief of Szeretet (Love), the monthly periodical of the Hungarian Baptist Convention of Romania. He became pastor of the Baptist church in Satu Mare in 1990, and previously served as pastor of churches in Hunedoara and Lupeni, all in Romania.

Ordained during the communist era on November 24, 1978 - exactly 32 years before his death - Vékás was at times called in and questioned by the police on account of his faith, but "he remained faithful to the Lord and didn't give in either to pressure or to promises," his obituary read.

A Romanian of Hungarian descent, he did theological studies with the International Baptist Theological Seminary in Ruschlikon, Switzerland, (since relocated to Prague, Czech Republic), and the Central Baptist Theological Seminary in Plymouth, Minnesota, in the United States.

A memorial service was held on November 26 at the Hungarian Baptist Church Satu Mare and funeral service on November 27 at the Rodnei Street Greek Catholic Cemetery chapel.

He leaves wife Elizabeth, daughter Blanka and son Benjamin.

In Memoriam: Julia Gero

Julia Gero, president of the European Baptist Women's Union (EBWU) from 1987-1992 and a former vice president of the Baptist World Alliance Women's Department, died in October, in Hungary. She was 83 years old.

After marrying Sandor Gero, a Baptist pastor, in 1950, Gero became actively involved in, and eventually leader of, the Baptist women's movement in Hungary, attending various meetings and conferences in Europe. She was appointed Hungarian representative to the EBWU in 1982, and became its first president from the communist bloc of nations when she was elected in 1987.

During her presidency of the EBWU, Gero was instrumental in helping to organize women's unions in the Soviet Union, Bulgaria, and among Hungarian women in Transylvania, Romania.

She was predeceased by her husband in 1981, and is survived by daughter Dorothy and son Erik..

Sajnos a 15 év leteltével a testvéreink már majdnem mindenkorban elköltöztek az Úrhol, írja, s noha még vagyunk kb. 15-en magyar baptisták, de jelenleg megszüntek az összejöveteleink. Sajnos ott van a szép imaház, amit építettünk, de most ott argentínok jönnek össze.

Varga testvér továbbra is látogatja a magyar testvéreket, s ha kell, az úrvacsorát is kiosztja. "Sajnálattal kell tudomásul vennünk, hogy a tudomásom szerinti egyedüli Dél Amerikai magyar baptista gyülekezet is megszűnt, mint olyan. Nagyon hálásak vagyunk a testvéreknak, hogy mindeddig elküldték az Evangéliumi Hírnököt, mert valóban jó dolog tudni hittestvéreinkről, és épülni abból, ami történik és lélekben együtt lenni, másokért imádkozni."
